Members of the Catholic Church of Torrance are to have an active part in the forthcoming National Conference of Catholic Charities, to be held in Los Angeles September 4 to 8. To co-operate with the general executive committee appointed by the Rt. Rev. Bishop John J. Cantwell, D.D., the following committee from Nativity Church, Torrance, has been appointed: James Anderson, Bernard Gannon, Theodore Wertz, Carl Gramling, and Arthur Mullins.

According to D. Joseph Coyne, Los Angeles attorney and chairman of the general arrangements committee, several thousand delegates from the east and north, embracing workers in all lines of welfare work, will be in attendance, and during their stay will visit many communities, including this city.

Speakers of international fame will be heard during the conference. James Anderson, Bernard Gannon, Theodore Wertz, Carl Gramling, and Arthur Mullins.

A speaking campaign, to cover every community in southern and central California, is being organized.


