Lomita Theatre Offers List of First Class Pictures This Week

Building up to a dramatic climax which for sustained power, pathos and unparalleled conflict of emotion and will has not been approached since the famous trial scene in "Madame X", a paean to the power of woman in politics, under the compelling title of "Her Honor the Governor," comes Thursday and Friday to the Lomita Theatre. Starting with the old idea of a husband being in a predicament because of a quarrel with his wife—a predicament that is likely to cost him a one hundred thousand dollar legacy—it develops speedily into a picture marked by fresh, smart observation of character and is filled with surprising original twists. Louise Fazenda has the role of Sissaretta Simpkins, the servant in the house, who is called upon to step into her mistress's shoes. The part affords Miss Fazenda a glorious opportunity for laughs. She is assisted by a cast that includes John T. Murray, William Demarest, Jane Winton and Ed Kennedy. Herman Raymaker directed. Next Tuesday and Wednesday the Lomita will offer a double bill showing Ranger in "The Outlaw Dog" and George O'Hara in "Ladies Beware." Both of these pictures are well worth seeing and when both of them are placed on one bill, the show becomes an exceptional attraction.
