Mrs. McCulloch Brings Back Ideas from U. S. Conclave Mrs. F. O. McCulloch, state president of the California Congress of Parents and Teachers, has just returned from the National Board of Managers meeting held at Atlantic City, New Jersey.

The following resolution was passed by the National Board: Whereas special interests appear to be launching an attack on the Children's Bureau of the Department of Labor; resolved that in view of the service received by the states from the Bureau as testified at this meeting by state presidents—that the National Board of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers express its appreciation of the constructive work of the Children's Bureau, and urge the states to support and study its activities.

The National Board recommends to its various branches that they pass into active carry out. With this Board Mrs. McCulloch attended a Federal Educational conference at Washington, D. C., at which Mr. John J. Eggert, Commissioner of Education, presided. Mr. Tiggert made the statement that the United States government is 100 per cent back of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers, because of their educational support.

While in Washington, the National Board of Managers were honored with a reception given by Mrs. Calvin Coolidge in the White House. Mrs. McCulloch, California state president was among those thus honored.

The board of managers of the California Congress of Parents and Teachers met in Fresno, Cal., October 11 and 12. The following appointments were ratified: Safety, Mrs. F. G. Matteson of Bakersfield, who is past president of the Seventh district; Humane Education, Mrs. J. W. Bingham of Palo Alto; National chairman of P. T. in Colleges; Physical Education, Dr. Sven Lokrantz, director of Health and Corrective Physical Education for the Los Angeles city schools.

A state life membership was presented Mrs. F. O. McCulloch, state president. University Extension credit course classes in visual appreciation will be conducted in Los Angeles by Mrs. Ered M. McAttee, state chairman and assistant director of visual education in the Los Angeles city schools, and in San Francisco by Mr. Edward Mayer, secretary of Visual Instruction University of California.
