



REV. CAMERON ACQUITTED
Lecture delivered by Dr. W. Grant Hess, founder and Bishop of the Chirothesian Church of Faith, Torrance, California, Rev. M. F. Cameron, pastor. The Chirothesian Church of Faith was founded by Dr. W. Grant Hess of Los Angeles. It was duly incorporated August 2, 1917, under the laws of the state of California, for the purpose of holding religious services and ceremonies in accordance with the teachings of the New Testament, and to teach, train, qualify and ordain ministers, practitioners and teachers to give relief to humanity from all manner of sickness or disease, whether spiritual menst. members; so we have classes for the benefit of lay members or those who wish to understand something regarding healing by the laying on of hands. Chirothesia means "the laying on of hands."

The Constitution of the United States under Amendments, Article I states: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof."

Article XIV, Section I reads: "No state shall make or enforce any laws which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States—nor to deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws."

Hence, in common with all religious organizations we have a right according to the constitution of the United States to practice according to our own belief.

New religions have ever been persecuted by the old established methods. Even Jesus was persecuted because his teachings were not in accord with the prevailing doctrines. Rev. M. F. Cameron, our beloved minister and leader of the First Chirothesian Church of Faith of Torrance, California, was arrested for preaching, teaching and healing according to our faith. In accordance with our articles of faith he was trying to follow the example of Jesus Christ in preaching and healing. In the 12th verse of the 11th Chapter of John, Jesus declares: "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do, because I go unto my Father."

Brother Cameron was relying upon the constitution of the United States for the free exercise of his religious belief, in preaching and healing. By following the commands of Jesus in using the power given by God to heal. Such miraculous cures were performed through our earnest zealous brother that he was persecuted by an arrest. Jesus, our great example was arrested and brought forth before Pilate, who declared him innocent. Yet Pilate was forced by the mob to yield Jesus to crucifixion.

On Nov. 8th, 1927, Rev. Cameron was before the Judge on the accusation of healing. Witness after witness testified Rev. Cameron laid his hands upon them and they were healed. The cases were remarkable—like a miracle. None said aught against our beloved brother.

This being an enlightened age it dawned upon the Judge and Prosecuting Attorney that Rev. Cameron was only exercising his religious right according to the constitution of the United States. So the Prosecuting attorney said the cases should never have been submitted. The Judge recommended the acquittal to the jury, who after retiring about five (5) minutes, returned with a verdict of "Not Guilty." The Prosecuting Attorney in making the statement that the case should not have been presented, likely realized the cost all cases are to the taxpayer; therefore cases wherein no illegal act had been committed, should not be presented.

The tax payers pay the cost of presenting the case, while the expense of Rev. Cameron's defense has to be met by our church. Longfellow says: "The dawn is not distant; Nor is the night starless; Love is eternal; God is still God, and His faith shall not fail us; Christ is eternal." Adv.

Wife Savers

DESSERTS AND DRINKS
There are so many delightful dishes which may be made and frozen unspiced or spiced, that there is an infinite variety from which to choose.
Cherry Mousse.—To a pint of double cream add three tablespoons of powdered sugar, a cupful of cherry pulp and a drop or two of almond extract. Whip the cream until stiff, then add the other ingredients. Turn into a mold, cover closely and pack in ice

and salt for four hours.
Nougat Ice Cream.—Cook together a cupful of sour cream and a cupful of sugar until it reaches the soft-ball stage when tried in cold water, flavor and add a cupful of hickory nut meats or pecans, add one quart of rich milk to which has been added a cupful of sugar and when cool freeze as usual.
Fruit Crown.—Peel, core and quarter three sweet apples and three quinces, cover with sweet cider and cook until tender, remove the apples unbroken. Measure the cider and add enough to make a pint. Over half a box of cereal pour half a cupful of cold cider, set into cold water and stir until it begins to thicken, then turn into a border mold, tipping the mold so that the jelly will line the mold. Now fill with chopped cooked quinces and the apples. Cover with jelly and set away to chill. Invert on a cold dish and fill the center with sweetened cream or pour it around the mold. Garnish with browned almonds.
Grape Nectar. To a quart of grape juice add a pint of sirup and the juice of four oranges. Chill, and when serving add a bottle of charged water.
Pineapple Drink.—Add a pint of prepared sirup (water and sugar cooked together) to a pint of grated pineapple. Set on ice for three hours, add a bit of lemon juice, strain and serve.
Grape Juice prepared as a drink is delightful with addition of a bottle of ginger ale.
