

tion of Intention No. 338 to order  
the following work to be done and  
improvement to be made, within  
said city, to-wit: the closing up,  
vacating and abandoning of that  
portion of a street described as fol-  
lows:

That portion of Lot S-3, Torrance  
Tract, as recorded in  
Map Book 22, Pages 94 and 95,
