Al Wilson in "Three Miles Up" will take Lomita Theatre patrons above the clouds for a thrilling and entertaining evening, when this picture comes to the screen tonight and tomorrow. In addition to the feature, a good comedy and news reel, will be offered. For Saturday, the program will be "The Fighting Thoroughbred," Comedy and Felix the Cat. Michael Strogoff, the Universal Film de France super production, made by the French Societe des Cineromans from the famous novel and play by Jules Verne, and which has been hailed on all sides since its recent Paris premiere as the most interesting picture ever made under French auspices, will be shown at the Lomita theatre on Sunday and Monday, Dec. 11 and 12. "Michael Strogoff" long has been one of the favorite plays for repertoire companies, both in Europe and in America. In this country it is second in popularity only to "Uncle Tom's Cabin." The novel was translated into nineteen different languages and is one of the most widely read pieces of literature known. The big film was made mostly in Latvia, where V. Tourjansky, noted Russian director, took a large company of principals to find locations approximately the actual Russian and Siberian locations of the story, which is a romance of the love and adventures of a young Russian officer of 1859 on a perilous trip through Tartar infested country to Irkutsk, in danger of capture by Feogor Khan, the Tartar leader. Five thousand troops of the Latvian Army were used as extras, 4,000 infantrymen and 1,000 troopers, in addition to a detachment of artillery. The battle scenes between the Tartars and the Russian garrisons or relief forces are among the most outstanding ever done for the screen. Tuesday and Wednesday, Dec. 13 and 14, a big double bill will be offered, featuring "The Wheel of Destiny"; "The Border Cavalier" and a comedy, "King of the Kitchen."




