

## "Roads Special" Makes a Stop in Torrance

Train-Motor Car Touring States to Increase Good Road Activities

Not a locomotive run wild but a de-luxe motor car with the appearance of an engine is the "Good Roads Special" which made its appearance in Torrance Monday, touring through the streets, stopping at business places and giving residents a chance to gauge the enterprise of the auto industry.

This super-special automobile is sent out by the Kelly-Springfield Tire company to acquaint the public with the necessity for good roads. As a result of the tremendous increase in the use of motor vehicles these roads are being modernized and improved at the rate of 50,000 miles a year.

The Goods Roads Special was brought here by Mullin and Son, and the M. J. Fix Co., solid and truck tire dealers, who handle Kelly-Springfield tires.

The car, which from the front looks like a locomotive and from the rear, an observation car, is a beautiful piece of mechanism.

It is built on a 147-inch wheel-base, with a six cylinder heavy duty Continental motor and Ross steering gear. Its realism is heightened by the fact that it has a smoke-stack that emits smoke, a real bell and whistle, a sandbox and Westinghouse air brakes.

All the fittings are solid brass except the door handles, etc., which are gold-washed.

The tires are Kelly-Springfield 33x6-15 Heavy Duty Corps. They are carrying a weight of 6150 pounds.
