Genius is setting its imagination to working overtime on the creation of the blouse. Perhaps the sumptuousness of this season's fabrics accounts for the present outburst of enthusiasm on the part of the mode for the blouse which bespeaks ultra-elegance.

The subject of velvet for the blouse is a most enticing one. It embraces every type from solid colored transparent velvets to most elaborate brocade and faconne prints or weaves. For the smart daytime costume, fashion is featuring the blouse of novelty velvet with the skirt of black or solid-color velvet as shown in the illustration.

The blouse of this chic two-piece model is made of sheer velvet striped in gold metal and multi-colors softly subdued and harmoniously blended. An elaborately carved novelty pin holds its hip folds in place. The skirt of black velvet has three small plaits in front to give it fullness.

With a skirt and coat of velvet and a selection of blouse suited to both formal and informal occasion one need not be disturbed with the "what-to-wear" question throughout the coming months.

It is difficult to conceive of anything more handsome in the way of a blouse than a model which employs transparent velvet with incrustations of metal lace in the form of a deep plastron yoke; front and back with motifs of the lace on the sleeves.

Less formal blouse themes highlight printed velvets, blues with red being especially modish, also white polka dots on black. Coin dots of velvet on georgette crepe are also very popular.

Clever, too, is the blouse which combines several tones or shades of velvet in artful patchwork designs, similar to the way jersey cloth is sewed together in stripes and various intriguing interworkings.

Course in Air Commerce Plan

The University of Southern California announces an evening college course in Commercial Aviation to be given during the 1928 winter quarter of University College opening in January, according to President R. H. von Klein Smid.

Although courses dealing with technical phases of flight theory and airplane construction have been offered by other institutions, Southern California is said to be the first university offering a full-credit college course devoted exclusively to the economics of aircraft in commerce.

"With the firm establishment in this country during the past two years of practical airplane transportation, aeronautics has been taken from the field of the spectacular and introduced into the field of business, thus providing available data upon which to base scientific conclusions," states Dr. E. W. Ties, dean of University College, S. C. "Such data will be given to the adult class by authorities in commercial aeronautics in a series of evening lectures beginning next month."

The new air course will also be given on the Trojan campus in the fall of 1928, in the day classes of the College of Commerce and Business Administration, it is announced.



Build and Live in Torrance

Consistency in Arrangement is Advocated

"Consistent economy" in building is often emphasized. The emphasis is on both words. By economy we do not mean stinginess, the saving of a dime by skipping work that will require the expenditure of a dollar in repairs year after year. The economy is in spending wisely, not buying necessarily the most expensive thing, but the best thing for our particular need. What would be extravagance on one building project might be true economy on another. Each problem varies from all others, as every person's needs in a home differs from the needs of every other person.

We should always be on our guard to be consistent in economies in designing a house. Everything should be in the same

range of value. Do not let the materials of one part of the house be in the highest price range and in another part the lowest. Usually true economy will be found in more skillful planning and simplification, not in cheapening materials. The house illustrated this week is one entered in the competition held the Community Arts Association of Santa Barbara.

The communication throughout the house is good. Although the dining room has to be used as a passage way, one walks across only one end, thus mitigating what is usually a very disagreeable feature. Every part of the house is easily and directly accessible to every other part. The patio is very nice. The fireplace is in an unusual position. This may be interesting from the exterior but would not add to the

comfort of the living room. A variation from the plan shown would be to set the fireplace in the corner, or in the middle of the end. It might also be placed in the side of the room next to the patio, with the door from the living room to the patio at its right hand side.

Our principal criticism is the double gable at the front. It doesn't mean anything. There is a plan reason for a single gable, which would simplify the house and add to its beauty. It is a common error to try to get too many motives on one small house. If the double garage is used, it should be carried out honestly in construction with solid timbers with adzed surfaces and the stucco built in between.
