Petroleum Geology Course for U. S. C. Evening College

Announcement of the opening of a new evening course in "Petroleum Geology" is made by President R. B. vonKleinSmid of the University of Southern California, who states that the night class will open on Wednesday, January 4th, at 7:10, at University College, 132 E. 7th street.

Headed by Allen E. Sedgwick, consulting petroleum engineer and head of the department of geology on the Trojan campus, the oil course will open to men and women, and all those interested are invited to attend the initial lecture on Wednesday evening.

Application of engineering principles to the solution of underground problems of petroleum drilling will be covered in the 12-week once-a-week Wednesday evening class.

Registrations are taken on the 13th floor of the Transportation building, 7th and Los Angeles streets, or full information may be secured by calling TRinity 1701.

A Tuesday evening course in Petroleum Geology will also be given during the January-to-March Winter Quarter of University College, opening on Tuesday night, January 3rd, at 7:10, with visitors invited to the first meeting of the group.

The daily quantity need of phosphorus is greater for both child and adult than any other mineral. Although found in a great variety of foods, the family can suffer from a shortage of phosphorus if it indulges in too many sweets, fats and refined cereals.

An abundant supply of whole grain products, specially wheat and oats must be provided. For phosphorus supply, cheese is the cheapest, but not desired in great quantities. Milk is almost as good a source of phosphorus as of calcium and it can be used in far greater quantities than cheese. Eggs, especially the yolk are a good phosphorus food but they are not in the every day price of low cost food budgets. Fish, especially cod and haddock, are fairly cheap phosphorus foods; oysters are good, but too expensive, except for liberal dietaries. The cheap lean cuts of meat give far better phosphorus values than the more prized tender fat cuts.

Children need phosphorus as much as calcium for growing bones. If their food is phosphorus poor they are likely to suffer from the most common types of rickets.

—the "low-phosphorus rickets." A child allowed to eat freely of "just what he likes", is running the grave risk of not getting his necessary bone growing foods. Children and adults need phosphorus in every tiny cell of body tissues. Phosphorus helps to regulate the acids and the bases in the blood. Without phosphorus to assist in burning up the starches and sugars in the body, neither child nor adult could play or work up to par. Wasting illnesses call for special aid from phosphorus.

Every day buy liberally the cheap foods rich in this essential mineral for the health of a growing family.—Christmas Seal Service.





A Wee Home for a Wee Family With a Wee Purse



Bungalows for small families, designed to fit nicely on narrow lots and not to impose prohibitive burdens upon the man of limited means yet providing all of the ordinary comforts, are sometimes difficult to find. This plan omits nothing essential to comfort and convenience. It is simple in arrangement yet very practical, easy to build and comparatively inexpensive as building goes today. And it has attractiveness which is equally necessary to the investor, who may some day desire to sell it. Built of common brick its durability will always insure the maximum resale value.

Convenience is the keynote of the interior arrangement. The only stairway is to the basement. Throughout it is a step saver and every housewife appreciates what this means. Compactly grouped it is only a step from any one of the rooms to the other. And the placing of the bath in the center of the house was a very happy thought, certain to please. Porches at both front and rear complete the plan ideally. Living and dining rooms, both surprisingly large for a house of its dimensions, are lighted by windows on two sides each, while the bed room, similarly treated, has double windows in front.



Cheerfulness is always to be an asset in this home. The bedroom has a good sized closet and another, built-in, with trays for storing the myriad articles in every household. In the little hallway, just outside, is an ample linen closet. Built-in china closets are a feature of the dining room which will be appreciated. The kitchen is also exceptionally large with the usual conveniences and an attached outside room, an enclosed continuation of the rear porch, for the accommodation of the refrigerator and fittings with shelves for the convenient storage of supplies. The basement is excavated the entire

dimension of the house and complete with the usual divisions. This bungalow will fit into any surroundings and any condition from an industrial district to a lakeside summer colony. Comfort, durability, and good appearance are insured if built of brick, with the absolute minimum of upkeep expense. It is essentially practical without attempt at special ornamentation.
