A. P. Giannini has donated \$1,500,000 to the University of California for the aid in the agricultural interests of the state.

On a quick dash to the United States President Cosgrave of the Irish Free State and his executive council have visited New York, Chicago, and Washington where they have been dined, and entertained in a rapid fire series of luncheons, dinners, banquets and receptions.

Charles Evans Hughes, former secretary of state, and former chief justice of the United States Supreme Court, speaking at Havana, Cuba, set forth in frank terms the policies of the United States in Central and South America. His address which dealt openly with such controversial subjects as American policy in Nicaragua was almost unanimously praised by Latin-Americans.

Gov. Len Small of Illinois has flatly declined to recognize the authority of the United States senate. The senate voted that Senator-elect Frank L. Smith should not be seated because of the alleged frauds during his campaign.
