

that if anyone is locked inside, he will be provided with plenty of air.

On the second floor of the building is a large directors' room. The building will be heated by the Tesla system of steam heat by electricity and thermostatically controlled, and was installed by the Tesla Company of 948 South Flower street, Los Angeles.

The plumbing fixtures and installation was furnished by the Torrance Plumbing Company, and the complete electrical installation including the wiring, heat control, fixtures, and call system was done by the American Electric Company of 1324 Sartori Avenue, Torrance. The fixtures were furnished by the Lok-S-Top Fixture Company of 6493 Stanford Avenue, Los Angeles. Ventilation is assured by a special ventilating plant which will cool the building in summer.

James W. Leech is manager of the Torrance branch. A local advisory board consists of W. Rufus Page, A. Brady Wolfe, Frank Sam-

mons and Dr. A. P. Stevenson. The completion of the new Bank of Italy building is regarded here as a high testimonial to that institution's confidence in the future growth and progress of the city.

Printing Course to Be Offered at Evening High

The Torrance Evening High School announces the opening of a new class for the ensuing semester. Beginning Wednesday, February 7, a course in printing will be offered under the direction of the day school printing teacher, Mr. Herbert B. Andrews. Mr. Andrews is a printer of wide and long experience, having served as journeyman, foreman, superintendent, estimator, salesman, and for the past fourteen years as teacher in the schools of the state. He spent seven years as instructor at Jefferson High School, Los Angeles, and while there taught night classes as well as day.

The courses offered are vocational rather than vocational, though apprentices who wish to continue their preparation will be afforded to study and practice within the limits of the shop equipment. Beginners will be trained in the fundamentals, in a course corresponding to the first ten weeks of a beginning day class. Chalk overlay, platen presswork, linoleum block printing, can be studied if desired.

It is intended to utilize the lesson sheets issued by the United Typothetae of America, when students desire.
