Mr. Schultz called from the Ford assembling plant in Los Angeles and stated that other deliveries will follow shortly. "The ice is broken," said Mr. Schultz, "and we advise our friends in Torrance and Lomita to place their orders for the new Fords on file at once in order to get deliveries before the Spring drive, as all orders will be filled strictly according to the time received."

Would Curb Loan Sharks, Handling Bancitaly Stock

Only the regular quarterly dividend of 56 cents per share will be paid by Bancitaly Corporation, it has been announced by A. F. Giannini, following the meeting of the board of directors yesterday afternoon.

"No extra dividend is to be paid at this time," said Giannini, "and we may decide to continue this same policy throughout the balance of the year. We are determined to force liquidation by making it difficult for the speculators to carry the stock on money borrowed at usurious rates, because of the wide margin between the dividend received and the high rate of interest paid. The excessive rates the people are being made to pay by a number of loan companies will not permit them to carry the stock on the basis of the normal return. It is this consideration that has prompted our board of directors to refuse to take action on any proposal for a special or extra dividend."

Bancitaly Corporation carries an annual dividend rate of \$2.24, but in past years the stockholders have received cash on stock dividends, as well as rights to subscribe to new issues. The present attitude of Giannini, in an effort to drive out "loan sharks," indicates that the stock will now be traded in only as a security for permanent investors.
