Dr. Riesenfeld was responsible for scores of such pictures as "The Miracle Man," "Ten Commandments," "The Covered Wagon," "Hunchback of Notre Dame," "King of Kings," and many other noteworthy productions. ### Film Stars on Air Tonight in Dodge Program

Fairbanks, Chaplin, Norma Talmadge and Others to Talk

Dodge Brothers, Inc., of Detroit tonight sponsor one of the biggest radio hook-ups yet accomplished when movie stars of Hollywood go on the air nationally in the "Dodge Film Stars Radio Hour," over KFI. Dodge Brothers, which has been a leader in use of radio for national entertainment hook-ups, introduced the Victory Six in a national broadcast the first of the year. The "Dodge Film Stars Radio Hour" will be on an even larger scale, with Norma Talmadge, Charlie Chaplin, Douglas Fairbanks, D. W. Griffith, John Barrymore and Dolores Del Rio as artists. Paul Whiteman and his band, broadcasting from New York will be part of the program. More than two score radio stations will be used, and the hook-up by the National Broadcasting Company will be consolidated through two transcontinental telephone lines of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company.

The "Dodge Film Stars Radio Hour" is to be on the air from 6 to 7 P. M., Pacific Standard time. Douglas Fairbanks will act as toastmaster at his Hollywood bungalow, whence the stars will broadcast. He himself will talk on "Keeping Fit." John Barrymore will render Hamlet's "Soliloquy." Norma Talmadge is to speak on "Women's Fashions in the Motion Picture World." D. W. Griffith has chosen "Love" as the subject of his talk, while Dolores Del Rio will sing a Spanish song.

As was the case with the Victory Hour early this year, the new radio event is co-ordinated with extensive newspaper and magazine advertising of the Dodge Brothers cars and Graham Brothers trucks.

### Hollywood Circus to Pull Stakes

Hollywood, March 29—Announcement was made here today by Sid Grauman that the engagement of Charlie Chaplin's "The Circus," with Grauman's spectacular production, "Ballyhoo," presenting famous stars of the sawdust ring, will continue only a few weeks more at Grauman's Chinese Theatre.

Arrangements made in advance for the booking of another big production will make it necessary to terminate the record-breaking run of Chaplin's latest mirthmaker before many weeks, according to Grauman. At the same time, many of the internationally famed circus stars of the prologue also have bookings with the big shows who shortly will come out of winter quarters.

To date, near to 250,000 persons have made the pilgrimage to Hollywood to view the laugh classic, hailed by many as Chaplin's most hilarious production. Visitors from far distant points in numbers, have come here to view the combined presentation in view of the fact that the film will never be shown elsewhere in connection with Grauman's famous aggregation of stars of the big tops.

Presented in the prologue are such world-famed circus performers as Poodles Hanneford, ace of riding clowns, and his troupe; Ed and Jenny Rooney, supreme acrobats; Pallenberg's famous roller skating and bicycling bears; the Three Freehands, equilibrist; Slayman All's acrobatic clowns; Pepito, noted European pantomimist clown and many others.

In connection with the showing, Grauman has gathered a half score of famous, sidshow characters for an open air display in the forecourt which also includes a huge menagerie of cleverly operated mechanical beasts of the jungle.
