## Kern Creamery Enlarge Plant Buy Competitor

### Blue Ribbon Dairy Taken Over and Distribution of Quandt Raw Milk

The Kern Creamery, Incorporated, announced the purchase of the Blue Ribbon Dairy of Torrance and the enlargement of the Kern plant. A new bottle washing machine, capable of cleansing and sterilizing 40,000 bottles every eight hours is now being installed and the Kern Creamery plant is being extended to the alley, giving them a depth of 15 feet.

The Kern Creamery has recently been appointed sole distributors for Quandt Brothers grade A raw milk, which won the highest honors in the entire Southbay district including Long Beach, in the last official test conducted by the Los Angeles County Department of Health. Kern pasteurized milk and cream was awarded second highest honors in the same test.

In commenting upon the increasing demand for Kern products and the resultant enlargements of its plant at 1336 Post avenue, Fred Kern, president of the corporation said, "We are indeed grateful to the people of this district for their splendid patronage and we want them to feel that they are always welcome to come and visit our plant on Post avenue, so that they may see with their own eyes just how clean we keep everything."
