

5000 Will Attend Conference of Rotarians at Sacramento; Eight Will Go from Torrance

Five thousand business executives will attend the Rotary conference in Sacramento on May 10-11-12.

The principles enunciated by service clubs are responsible for modern business assuming a new role. These principles were initiated by the Rotary club which has become an international organization. California, Nevada and Hawaii comprise the second district of Rotary International. The district conference is a high spot in the Rotary year. Fifty two of these gatherings are being held in the United States and Canada this spring.

Entertainment of a most unique character is being provided to relieve the tension resulting from the strenuous business program, on which program will be featured Roy Knoepfel of New York, Bill Mander of Nashville, Tenn., Ray Havens of Kansas City and Eddie Flynn of St. Paul—to hear any one of whom will be worth the trip to Sacramento.

District Governor Almon E. Roth of Palo Alto, California, will preside over the conference at Sacramento. It will last three days and will consist of general sessions, round table discussions and entertainment features. The discussions will include such subjects as: ethical business methods, Rotary extension, boys' work, civic responsibilities of Rotarians, etc.

Sacramento, with its splendid hotel accommodations and its new Memorial Auditorium, is fully prepared to extend the hospitality of California's state capital to the thousands of business executives who are devoting their time, their effort and their energy toward the promotion of modern business thought and ethics into the civic life not only of America but practically all civilized countries of the world.

One-hundred forty-seven clubs comprise the second district. Already thirty-two clubs have registered their entire membership for the conference—this is exactly double the number of one-hundred-percent-club that have registered at any previous conference.

Rotarians throughout the district are being urged to bring their wives and come to Sacramento, where they will profit from the greatest of all business conferences and contribute to the success of the regime of District Governor Al Roth, making this year

Club Listens to Fine Talk

Mrs. Ruth Sin Clair Tells Women About Luther Burbank

Mrs. Ruth M. Sin Clair, of Hermosa Beach, whose father was associated with Luther Burbank at his experimental garden at Sebastopol, spoke before the Women's Club on "Luther Burbank As I Knew Him." Mrs. Sin Clair told many very interesting things of Mr. Burbank and his work. These experimental gardens stand very much as Mr. Burbank left them when he passed on.

Living in Sebastopol and having her "Little Stepfather" so closely connected with Mr. Burbank, Mrs. Sin Clair spoke from her personal knowledge of Mr. Burbank gained through her close touch with him and his work. In speaking of the grafting of trees she stated that as space had to be conserved it was not unusual to see during the plum season, especially, fruits of different colors nesting close together on one limb.

Mr. Burbank did much to further the temperance cause in Sonoma county, not so much that he cared how the men spent their money but that they must have a taste that had not been imparted in order to be able to test the sugar contents of the fruit and for this reason no man employed on the experimental garden could be a user of tobacco or liquor.

In speaking of the widespread idea that Luther Burbank was an unbeliever Mrs. Sin Clair stated that this idea was sent out by a reporter who interviewed Mr. Burbank asking him about religion and Mr. Burbank answering him that all religion was good. On being asked about his belief in heaven and hell in his reply, Mr. Burbank said that we got a good deal of heaven here. It is the belief of some of Mr. Burbank's friends that this idea of his belief hastened his death.

During his last illness he asked his physician, who was also a friend of long standing, how any one could think that he did not believe in a Christ and a Saviour whom he had lived so long with so many beautiful creations.

In describing the town of Santa Rosa and telling of its beauty, Mrs. Sin Clair said that Torrance reminded her of Santa Rosa.

Mr. John Oliver of Fort McArthur recently purchased a new Dodge standard six sedan from Allen H. Faulk.






Interesting Texture in Italian Villa
