Youthful Modes Stress Velvet Jackets in Attractive Colors

IN REGARD to that three-piece dressy afternoon ensemble of your plans and your dreams, and you thought about velvet for the jacket? Feeling that velvet is revealing the enthusiastic endorsement of leading stylists, as a suitable fabric for spring and summer, as well as for autumn and winter wear, one really could not make a happier selection than this delicate weave.

Young girls are choosing colorful velvet for short jackets to be worn with silk plaited skirts, while their elders are luxuriating in exquisite separate coats topping their summery frocks of sheer prints and pastel chiffons.

Color is outstanding for the youthful velvet jacket types. The original of the model photographed is carried out in beige tones, the frock 'clung' of crepe with the skirt featuring the popular all-around plaiting. This same style would be very attractive in wine tones or in one of the new soft greens. A stunning sports item is that of the quilted velvet jacket, these have an imported look, although

some of them are being made by the best stylists in this country. They are extremely good-looking, and they top jallied silk skirts or those of sheer woolen weaves, to perfection. They are charming with summer lingerie frocks, too.

Ideal as a dressy summer wrap and lending an elegant note, are the seven-eighths-length, topcoats made of sheer black velvet. Almost without fail these coats are made with a scarf collar with long streamer ends to be wrapped about the throat or let fall in graceful lines. Lined with white brocade or plain crepe, and with a boutonniere of white violets or a cluster of gardenias, these velvet coats are the very essence of smartness.

When intended as a general wrap white is preferred for the lining, but if the ensemble theme is to be carried out, the coat is lined with the same material as that of the frock which it complements.
