

## Seek National Editorial Meet for California in 1932



California will be host to the editors of the nation in 1932, Olympic Year, if the invitation to come here is accepted by the National Editorial Association during its June convention in Memphis, Tenn. First step to make California the convention center of America in 1932 was taken when an invitation was sent to the National Editorial Association, which is to convene at Memphis, Tenn., early in June to hold its 1932 annual meeting in this state. The invitation was issued by William May Garland, president of the California Tenth Olympiad Association, and was taken to Memphis by John Long, executive secretary of the California Newspaper Publishers' Association.

Because the international Olympic Games of 1932 will be held in California and correspondents from all over the world will be here to describe the events, it is believed probable the National Editorial Association will welcome the opportunity to hold the convention of that year in this state.

Many other national organizations are expected also to decide on California as the place to hold their annual conventions in 1932. As the Olympic Games will continue over a period of seven or eight months, a wide range of dates is open to the various bodies in which to hold their conventions here. The attractions that will be afforded by the Olympiad, embracing competitions in "the arts and sports and athletics, are expected to be a magnet that will draw a great number of important gatherings to this state.

The Torrance Herald and Lomita News are members of the California Newspaper Publishers' Association, which extended the invitation to the national newspaper association.

## "Race of Century" With Paddock, Borah, Lombardi to Feature Southwest Olympics

International attention is being focused on the Southwest Olympic finals to be held June 16 at the Los Angeles Coliseum, following definite announcement during the past week that the "Race of Century" is definitely on. This will feature Charley Paddock, Charley Borah, Frank Lombardi, and Frank Wykoff in a 100-yard dash that may forecast the winner of the 100 meters run in the Olympic Games at Amsterdam this summer.

Sporting fans of each of the 46 nations competing in the Olympic Games, in addition to many other countries, will eagerly await news of the winner of this great foot-race. The fame of Paddock is worldwide and other nations want to know if there are any other California sprinters capable of defeating him.

Locally, interest in the Southwest Olympic finals has increased manifold. Ticket sales at the B. H. Dyan Co. are moving forward much more rapidly than before and everywhere sporting fans are discussing the coming classic. Mail orders for tickets at \$1, \$2 and \$3 prices are being filled at Olympic Games headquarters, 1116 W. Washington street, Los Angeles.

Paddock, the old campaigner and victor by an inch over Borah in their only meeting two years ago, is being heavily backed. Borah, national 100 yards champion in 1926 and 220 (titled) in 1927, is not without support. And many there are who think that either Wykoff or Lombardi will beat Paddock or Borah or both. The Wykoff-Lombardi duel is lining up as a race within a race and there is almost as much interest in whether Wykoff can beat Lombardi as there is in whether Paddock can beat Borah.

Included on the monster program will be a complete Olympic schedule of track and field events, introduction of motion picture stars, a Parade of Nations, music by a 1000-piece high school band and boxing exhibitions by Jack Dempsey, Fidel LaBarba, Jackie Fields and Mushy Callahan.

Lovers of mystery drama with thrills a plenty, will be delighted with "The Devil Within," starting Sunday, June 3 for a week's run in the beautiful Tent Theatre in Hermosa Beach.

## No Breakfast Fad Causes Tuberculosis

The alarming increase of tuberculosis among high school girls is attributed as due in a large measure to the "no breakfast" habit and the feminine vogue of the "boyish figure" by Dr. S. W. Sansum, director of the Foster Metabolic Clinic at Santa Barbara in his lecture on "Underweight and Indigestion" given under the auspices of the Southern California Public Health Association.

"The fad of 'starving' among girls to attain unnatural slenderness attained such proportions as to become a national danger to our young womanhood," said Dr. Sansum. "Breakfast is a very essential meal. Lack of appetite does not indicate a lack of need but is the result of late sleeping and hurry. To maintain efficiency and vitality the body must be supplied the required number of calories. To cut down on needed food endangers the entire system.

"Statistics show the daily 'high peak' of accidents is reached at 11 a. m. and towards evening. This is because the stomach is then empty of food and vitality is low," Dr. Sansum pointed out. "Large concerns have found that it paid to serve their employees a mid-morning light meal in cutting down the percentage of accidents alone. Grapefruit or sweetened lemon juice taken with meals Dr. Sansum recommended as aids in supplying needed acid in the stomach of certain types of 'underweight' people to digest the proteins. The chewing of gum, Dr. Sansum also cited as beneficial in stimulating saliva that thin people often lack in sufficient amount to insure proper digestion.

"A person on a food ration of but 1100 calories would need to be kept in bed to conserve vitality," Dr. Sansum contended, while a child from 5 to 10 years of age needs 2500 calories and the girl in her teens 3500 calories to maintain a healthy body.

Dr. J. L. Pomeroy, president of the Association, introduced Dr. Sven Lokrantz, medical director of the Physical Education Department in Los Angeles City Schools who gave an illustrated address on the management of the school child with heart trouble.

### Don't Build a 'Box' Because You Have a Narrow Lot

The narrow lot presents a problem in home building but it is an issue to be faced where such a condition exists, and not one to be evaded. Many people are prone to accept the conditions imposed by the narrow lot as making an attractive house out of the question and to accept a "box" type house.

That is wrong. A house can be designed to fit a narrow lot and have artistic merit of the first order. It is a matter of mature experience and ability on the part of the architect.

The house illustrated herewith measures twenty-six feet across the front including the extending wing wall and a lot with a frontage of thirty-five feet gives space for a driveway and a good setting.

The plan layout is thoroughly practical and economical while the architectural character of the exterior is above reproach. From the "checker" chimney top to the attractive entrance doorway, from the graceful sweep of the roof to the pattern of the window shutters, there is apparent that stamp of character that marks the work as that of a master designer.

A cellar extends under the entire house.
