



FOR THE MODERN INTERIOR A SKYSCRAPER BOOKCASE

The ubiquitous skyscraper effect is now a definite part of the 20th Century interior. Nor will any one deny that it has a right to this place, either. In the illustration sketched above is seen a splendid version of this new motif. The irregular line of the bookcase is pleasing and not a bit hard to live with, as one might at first glance assume to be the case. Here is plenty of space for books of varying sizes and for those porcelain novelties that pro-

claim the individuality of the proud collector. Closed compartments house the more precious volumes and prints that are better off unexposed to dust. They may also be utilized as an extra storage space for linens or such, if the capacity of the apartment so demanded. The exterior of this simple yet truly American product is black lacquer. The interior is finished in a contrasting shade of deep blue-green.



FOLLOWING THE TREND IN TABLES

An outstanding feature of the

modernist movement as regards furniture is the use of such rare and beautiful woods as Macassar ebony, amboyna, thuya, zebra and hawood. Small tables which are as modern in spirit and execution as 20th Century dictates would have them as a good medium with which to introduce the richness.

The home of the most conservative person would not be disrupted by the introduction of a small occasional table of the type illustrated in the sketch shown above. This piece is a product of domestic design and manufacture and clearly characterizes the changing age with its simplicity and directness of line. It measures nineteen by twenty four inches and stands nineteen inches high. The base of the table is of walnut and the top is of thuya wood.

Chevrolet Chiefs Tour West Coast

With production in fourteen great Chevrolet factories running at a record pace for this period of the year and sales continuing at the highest summer level in the history of the company, W. S. Knudsen, president of the Chevrolet Motor Company and R. H. Grant, vice president in charge of sales, are on the Pacific Coast on a three weeks' business tour.

In the course of the tour, which will include the leading business centers of the west, the Chevrolet executives will visit with Chevrolet dealers in each community, discuss individual dealer problems and study local business conditions as they pertain to Chevrolet.

Before leaving Detroit, Knudsen announced that production in the first seven months of the year to August first totalled 889,397 cars and trucks, breaking by a wide margin all former marks for this period and definitely indicating that the millionth car built in 1928 will come off the production line early in September. More than 400,000 of the "Bigger and Better" model are now in the hands of owners.

What Is Golf?

Golf is a form of work made extensive enough for a man to enjoy it. It is a physical and mental exercise made attractive by the fact that you sometimes have to dress for it in a \$200,000 clubhouse.

Golf is what letter-carrying, ditch-digging and carpet-beating would be if those three tasks had to be performed on the same afternoon, in short pants and colored socks, by gouty-looking gentlemen who required a different implement for every mood.

Golf is the simplest looking game in the world when you decide to take it up, and the toughest looking after you have been at it ten or twelve years.

It is probably the only known game a man can play as long as a quarter of century and then discover it was too deep for him in the first place.

The game is played on carefully selected grass with little white balls and as many clubs as the player can afford. These balls cost from 75 cents to \$5.00 each, and it is possible to support a family of ten people, all adults for five months on the money represented by the balls lost by some golfers in a single afternoon.

A golf course has eighteen holes, seven of which are unnecessary and out to make the same number. A "hole" is a tin cup in the center of a "green." A green is a small parcel of grass costing about \$1.98 a blade, and usually located between a brook and a couple of apple trees or a lot of unfinished excavation.

The idea is to get the golf ball from a given point into each of the eighteen cups in the fewest strokes and the greatest number of words.

The ball must not be thrown, pushed or carried. It must be propelled by about \$200 worth of carefully looking equipment, especially designed to provide the owner.

Each implement has a specific purpose, and ultimately some golfers get to know what that purpose is. They are the exception.

After each hole has been completed, the golfer counts his strokes. Then he subtracts six and says, "Made that in five. That's one above par. Shall we play for fifty cents on the next hole, too, Ed?"

After the final or eighteenth hole the golfer adds up his score and stops when he has reached eighty-seven. He then has a swim, and sings, "Sweet Adeline," with six or seven other lads, and then calls it the end of a perfect day.—Parker, S. D. New Era.


