Think Daylight Saving Would Be Good for South

Daylight saving was declared a boon to Torrance and the Southland at the directors' meeting of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce Monday night, and word was sent to the Los Angeles and San Francisco chambers of commerce that this city favored a statewide adoption of the daylight saving plan.

The idea of moving the clock forward one hour throughout the state originated in San Francisco, where it has met with almost unanimous approval except in the agricultural sections. Before lending its support to the movement, the Los Angeles chamber of commerce is endeavoring to ascertain the opinions from the cities of the Southland. If it is learned that a majority of the people of the state prefer the daylight saving schedule, it is expected that some statewide legislation will be enacted to make such a plan legal.


