**DeBra Explains New Type of Radio Circuit**

Sparton Equasone Is Outstanding Development of Age, Claim

The DeBra Radio Company announces the addition of the Sparton Equasone radio to their present line of Atwater Kent, Kolster and Crosley sets.

"In looking over the field of radio for the coming year," Mr. DeBra stated, "I was convinced that the outstanding development of the year was the new equasone circuit embodied in the Sparton. This new circuit gives a degree of selectivity, heretofore unattained and a reduction in static of approximately 40 percent."

"We have had three distinct types of radio circuits, and all existing receivers have been modifications of these three types. They are: (1) Regenerative, (2) Tuned radio frequency, (3) Super-heterodyne. Now comes a brand spanking new circuit. It is called the Equasone and it is not a modification of any existing type, but is fundamentally new," Mr. DeBra said.

"Due to the new circuit, all tuning is accomplished before entering the bank of amplifying tubes. As a result the amplification process cannot affect the selectivity and a band of 10 kilocycles wide is all that gets through the receiver. Incidentally, the only static and background noises that get through are those that happen to lie in that particular 10 kilocycle band."

"Long distance fans exclaim with pleasure when they first handle this equasone set. Only one stage of audio is used insuring the most perfect tone quality yet achieved. It is a 250 type power tube giving more volume with one stage than most sets attain with two or even three," Mr. DeBra claimed.
