Safe Turn Signals Are Safety Aid

Enable Drivers to Signal Turns Without Lowering Windows

Falling in line with the rigorous police campaign for safe driving and the lessening of accidents in this district, employees of the Safety Signal Corporation are lending their every assistance in the placing of helpful propaganda. It was learned this morning from M. J. Heyl, general manager of the new concern.

The above-mentioned corporation is distributing a new safety signal that is vacuum operated and has been approved by the Division of Motor Vehicles in the state of California. This was done after a thorough test had been made at Sacramento, executives believing it would do much towards eliminating accidents at intersections.

Figures compiled in the Safety-turn offices at 666 South Vermont avenue, Los Angeles, through the courtesy of the Southern California Automobile Club, show that 74 per cent of accidents occur at intersections due to improper signals given by drivers.

Heyl explains that the new signal which is being installed on police cars, ambulances, trucks and privately owned cars throughout the country, allows the drivers to make a correct signal with the windows closed.

This will prove of especial value to motorists during rainy weather when in many instances drivers fail to give signals because it is necessary to run down the windows to give the old-fashioned hand signal.

Safety drives are now under way in many of the cities of Southern California and heads of police departments have nothing but praise for the new California invention. Safe Turn signals are sold and installed by Dewey's Super-Service of Torrance.

THAT CAR OF YOURS

A squeak allowed to run on without being stopped by oil or grease is the forerunner of a repair bill.

A slippery fan belt means faster wear to the belt itself and cuts down the cooling of the motor which, in addition, may lead to a crank case oil leak. Keep grease and oil off the fan belt.

Twelve out of every thousand motorists, once each month, run out of gasoline on the highway. It has been estimated from service call figures. Fill up when your gas supply is low!

When the car is nicely washed and the chassis cleaned it is good time to go over all nuts and bolts for if this hasn't been done recently it will eliminate a great many squeaks and rattles as a rule.

Watching the oil gauge on the instrument board, the ammeter, and the oil level in the crankcase should be made a habit, for it is easy to run low on crankcase oil and distilled battery water without realizing it and oil pressure sometimes needs adjusting.

Squeaking brakes do not always mean that the lining has a hard or worn spot. But have them inspected by a capable mechanic for sometimes the lining rivets are exposed beyond the surface of the lining which will cause scoring of brake drums and means short life to the lining and added expense.

It is a good idea to flush and clean the radiator at least every 60 days. Do not stop flushing until all of the rusty water is gone and when it is found that a scale has formed inside of the radiator and water jackets, use washing or baking soda which cuts the scale and rust, and also stops any small leaks.


