


The whitewashed fieldstone house above has been designed after the fashion of the minor chateaux of France. Interesting roof lines, the deep entrance door reveal, the arched studio window with its iron railed balcony all heighten the impression it creates.


Although the garage is shown on the first floor plan it really is at a lower level. As the left side of the house fronts upon a slight hill the garage drive goes down an incline to the garage, below the studio.

The rooms throughout the house are compactly arranged. Entering by the front doorway we reach a small stair hall directly in back of which is the living room. This is a well proportioned room, lighted by adequate windows on three sides and with a door leading to a porch which envelops one corner. Part of the porch may be noted in the sketch. One wall of the living room contains a broad fireplace. To the left of the living room is the dining room. Its important features are a fireplace and a long range of casement windows overlooking the garden at the rear of the house. The kitchen is alongside the dining room and has a corner position which gives it the advantage of cross ventilation.

From the entrance hall rises the stairway to the second floor. At a mid point between first and second floors is a stair landing from which opens the door to the studio.

On the second floor are located four bedrooms, a sleeping porch and two baths. This house was designed by Julian Gregory, architect.

Ninth Inning Rally Wins Hot Game for Torrance Pastimers

Staging a ninth inning rally that netted two runs, the Torrance Pastimers defeated the Wilmington Tigers of a victory in Sunday's pastime at the C. C. M. O. park. The final score of a hard-fought game was 2 to 1.

Wilmington put over one run in the first inning. Montgomery, the Tiger lead-off man, spanked the first ball pitched for three bases, which so startled the Torrance boys that Ferguson unhooked a wild pitch, permitting Montgomery to score. The next three batters went out in a row, however, with two strike-outs and a foul fly to the catcher.

Torrance got to the Tiger pitcher for a total of ten hits during the nine innings, but were unable to make their blows count until the spectacular ninth when Harris hit and stole second. Goldman singled, advancing Harris and went to second on Claypool's out. Two men were gone when Wolf, new man in the line-up, caught one on the nose for a hot bouncer which jumped ten feet over the second baseman's head, Torrance's two runners registered and the game was all over.

Great disappointment prevailed among the Mexican rooting contingent which had come in force to watch their countrymen perform, when Torrance staged its horse-shoe finish, nosing out the Tigers. Fast clean ball marked the play all through.

Double plays twice cleaned the bases and robbed Torrance of possible scores.

Atwood was missed from the lineup owing to an attack of flu, but his place was ably filled at short by Salazar, the regular third baseman.


