Miss Margaret Hannan is working at Eby's Dollar Store during the holiday rush.


Mr. and Mrs. Paul Eby drove to Pasadena Sunday to spend the day with Mr. and Mrs. Claude Laytham.

**Famous Arabian Thoroughbred Will Head Rose Tournery Parade**

W. K. Kellogg's prize-winning Arabian stallion, Jadaan, shown above, is one of twenty thoroughbred Arabian horses being groomed at the Kellogg stables near Pomona for participation in the fortieth annual Tournament of Roses parade at Pasadena on New Year's Day. Victor McLaglen, screen star, is shown in the picture wearing the costume which he will don on New Year's Day when he rides Jadaan at the head of the rose tournery parade.

PASADENA.—California's great annual midwinter floral fete, the Tournament of Roses, seems likely to be larger and more resplendent next New Year's day than it ever has been in the past.

Tournament officials announced today that approximately three hundred units, including ninety huge floral floats and thirty bands, will make up the morning parade which features the tournament program. The ninety floats will represent about forty Pacific Coast cities and communities.

In addition to the floats and bands, the parade will comprise an equestrian division, a novelty division and a division devoted to blossom-decked automobiles. All units must be floral in nature and only fresh, natural flowers may be used.

Cities which will be represented by floats in the parade include San Francisco, Los Angeles, San Jose, Long Beach, Glendale, San Marino, San Bernardino, Inglewood, Taft, Sierra Madre, Beverly Hills, Whittier, Pomona, Anaheim and many others. The city of Los Angeles will enter three floats. Long Beach, which has been a participant in tournament parades for a quarter of a century, will have a larger and more elaborate float than ever before. Glendale will provide its usual sensational entry. Several cities, including Inglewood, will be in the tournament for the first time.

Pasadena, as usual, will contribute about thirty floats representing service clubs, fraternal organizations, public schools, churches, Boy Scout troops and hotels.

The division devoted to decorated automobiles will be much larger this year than in the past. Women's clubs throughout Southern California are sponsoring many of these entries.

"Poems in Flowers" is the theme for the 1929 tournament parade. Each float will depict in floral pageantry the title, central thought or principal character of some well known poem.

As for several years, the parade will get under way at 10:30 New Year's morning on Orange Grove avenue and Colorado street in Pasadena, proceeding east on Colorado to Hill, north on Hill to East Orange Grove and west on Orange Grove to the disbandment area between Lake and Los Robles. The route is five miles long and the column will reach from the starting point to finishing line.

The afternoon program at the tournament comprises a football
