Torrance Wins with 13 Swats

Local Team Trounces Wilmington Nine by 12 to 1 Score

Thirteen safe hits spelled a hoodoo for the Wilmington Tigers on their home grounds Sunday, and those thirteen hits produced a total of 12 runs for Torrance, five of them garnered in the first inning. Machado pitching for the Tigers was hit hard from the start and retired at the close of the sixth. The regular shortstop, went to the mound. The newcomer's slants were just as eagerly sought after as had been Machado's and in the midst of clouds of dust stirred up by a piercing wind Torrance batted around once more in the eighth and picked up five runs. On account of the stormy conditions of the diamond the umpire called the game at the end of the eighth.

Wilmington was unable to do anything with Ferguson this Sunday. Four safe hits was their quota, with 1 run scored by Montgomery after a scorching triple and a sacrifice hit by Moreno.

Besides Montgomery only three other Tigers reached first, two of them on passes. Twelve strikeouts dented the morale of the Tigers and the few blows that were whaled out were quickly garnered by the waiting Torrance fielders. Torrance batters were more fortunate in picking the uninhabited sections of the outfield or in placing their hits in the rough ground of the outskirts where the going was dangerous. Spectators at the edge of left field were scattered when Gonzalez dashed into the group after a high fly, found his path obstructed by "unmuchacho" some three feet high and both fielder and boy crashed to earth. Neither was injured.

Torrance will play the last game of the league schedule next Sunday against the Wilmington Merchants.

Gauchos Victors in Basketball

Narbonne's Gauchos won three of the four basketball games from George Washington high last week when the A, B and D teams triumphed while the C team lost a tough game.

The heavyweight game smacked strongly of football throughout with numerous off side penalties and a few for clipping. Captain Dabbert Chapman was high point man with seven points to his credit. Cox, Thistle and Paul made the other points. Baguley and Thorson although not scoring played nice defensive ball. The whole team has shown decided improvement and played a great game to defeat San Pedro 17-16 in a practice game earlier in the week.

Narbonne's B team hit their stride by sinking the Cherrypickers 25-12 in a game that started out very even. In the second half the locals found the basket and scored 14 points while Washington made five. Roland Trotman led the scorers with 10 markers with Captain Dick Carter close behind him with seven. Aspitte, Golding, Schultz and Hammack did the rest of the scoring. Cyril Serivner, the Texas cowboy, although not scoring played a fine game at guard. The entire team showed more drive and ability to hit the hoop than in previous games. If they keep up the present pace they still have a fine chance for the championship.

The "C" team was nosed out in the closing moments of play after holding a four point lead in the most spectacular shooting game of the season. Washington led 6-5 at half time and the Gauchos came back strong to forge ahead only to throw the game away in the last three minutes 21-19. Birdsall was high point man with five counters. Maki and Lang each scored four. Powers and Walker two and Captain Mankawa two. Although neither Sprout nor Blumenthal scored both played nice floor games.

The D team had a hard fight but some great shooting on the part of Funk and Captain Perwitz coupled with some fast floor work by the rest of the team enabled them to win 18-7. Funk made 8 points and Perwitz 6, while Armstrong scored two. Okamoto, Sasaki and Tomlinson all played nice ball and smothered the Washington offense. Argo, Schmidt and Markham all saw action and acquitted themselves in nice style.
