Jury of 12 Women Free Man in Lomita

After deliberating for one and a half hours, a jury of twelve women returned a verdict of not guilty in the case of James Fresca accused of assault and misdemeanor. The complaint was filed by J. Lockhart of San Pedro and was tried in the Lomita justice court Wednesday morning.

An altercation arose when Lockhart, a roomer at the home of Mrs. Ross Nicholas of West San Pedro, found Fresca sitting in a car, the property of Mrs. Nicholas. When Lockhart attempted to eject Fresca from the car, a quarrel followed, resulting in the complaint of assault and misdemeanor.

Six Ribs Broken as Car Turtles

Dr. Russell Shea of Redondo in Crash; Clips Two Trees; Light Post

Dr. Russell Shea of Redondo Beach, sustained six fractured ribs and minor cuts when the car he was driving overturned on Redondo boulevard last Thursday evening.

It was asserted that Dr. Shea lost control of his car on Redondo boulevard between Cola and Amargosa avenues, causing the car to leap the curb, clip off two large pepper trees in the parkway, and crash into one of the new light standards, knocking it to the ground.

The car, a new Packard sedan, overturned and was completely wrecked.

An ambulance took Dr. Shea to the hospital in Redondo, where he received treatment and was taken to his home at 523 S. Catalina street.
