Good Will Dinner on Japanese Ship WILMINGTON—Thursday noon officials of the N. Y. K. Line entertained several hundred guests from Los Angeles, San Pedro, Wilmington, Long Beach and San Francisco on board the Tenu Maru, a fine large passenger ship now docked in the harbor. Guests were escorted to the main dining room and were comfortably seated at tables while the Japanese orchestra played American airs. An eleven course dinner was served in the customary Japanese style and the chief of the ship was roundly congratulated for his delicious cuisine. Following the dinner the captain of the Tenu Maru was introduced and responded briefly in English. Likewise did the consul from Japan and many other Japanese officials connected with the N. Y. K. Line here and at San Francisco. Arrangements for the program were in charge of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce and Mr. James spoke interestingly on shipping facilities to the Orient and left with his hearers the thought that it costs more to ship freight to Bakersfield or the Imperial Valley than it did to ship the same cargo to Yokohama.
