

CALIFORNIA'S GOLDEN CHEQUE

Third of Coliseum Already Sold Out for June Pageant

LOS ANGELES, Calif., March 13—More than one-third of the huge Los Angeles Coliseum has been sold out for the \$1,000,000 motion picture electrical pageant and other Shrine convention Coliseum events here in June. This figure represents seats in excess of 25,000 which have been reserved at this early date.

No indication of a lull in the box office throngs is apparent and a complete sell-out appears inevitable, according to LeRoy M. Edwards, director general of the convention. Those living outside of Los Angeles are being advised by the Shrine management to obtain their tickets by mail.

"A sell-out will close the Coliseum gates to all not holding season tickets on the night of the mammoth \$1,000,000 motion picture electrical pageant, he declared. Applications for season tickets and reserve seats for not only the colorful pageant but for the spectacularness of the gigantic Circus Maximus and two huge dress parades as well, are being received at 1202 Broadway Arcade building and at Al Malakah Temple, 663 West Jefferson street, Los Angeles.
