


### Ambassador to the Arctic



The "Northland," successor to the famous cutter "Bear" in the Bering Sea, is again on her way to the Arctic regions. Each year, in the Spring, the Navy sends the ship north to act as ice breaker, mother ship, hospital and messenger to the inhabitants of the far North. A number of sailors aboard the "Northland" drive the new Chevrolet Six during their Winter stay in port.

The Coast Guard Cutter Northland leaves shortly for Arctic waters on its fourth cruise. Four years ago the Northland succeeded the famous old cutter Bear, which for many years carried mail, supplies, etc. to the various inhabitants of the northern ports, according to word received this week by Jack Hanson of the Torrance Motor Co., Chevrolet distributors.

The Northland will be on patrol duty along the Alaskan Coast and the islands of the Bering Sea until early October, at which time it returns to its home port in California.

Like the Bear, the Northland acts as a mail boat, holds federal court at the various ports of call along the coast, cares for smuggling, violation of the game and fish laws, and the welfare of the Indians and Eskimos.

Life aboard the Northland is pleasant. The boys who make up the crew, all of them members of the regular navy, take their duties in the nature of adventure, and had many tales to tell a party of visitors in a Chevrolet Six, of humorous incidents met with among the people of the ice and snow.

The Northland acts as the mother ship of the Alaskan Patrol of five Coast Guard Cutters. The other ships are: Cheilan, now at Unalaska, Unalga, Snohomist and the Halda.

### Only 1 Accident for 1500 Packards Says Robt. Tenan

Since January 1 of this year road testers of the Packard Motor Car company have driven nearly 15,000 cars under practically all the conditions found by the average motor car driver and have had just one accident. In this mishap the sum total of damage was one punctured tire and one dented fender.

From January 1, 1928 to January 1, 1929, with an average of more than 250 cars on the road daily there were only three accidents. Damage done to all the cars involved in these totalled four dented fenders, two damaged running boards, a scratched moulding and a scratched hub cap. No person was hurt. There is no record of a serious accident ever having occurred in the Packard road testing work, according to Robert Tenan, Packard dealer at Redondo.


### Desert Concert by Philharmonic at Perris Sunday

PERRIS, CALIF., April 11—The initial desert concert of the famous Los Angeles Philharmonic orchestra of 104 musicians will be played in the natural outdoor theatre near here next Sunday afternoon, April 14.

Mrs. J. J. Carter, founder of the Hollywood Bowl and leader of a movement for the encouragement of music among the American people under the banner "Every Desert and Every Valley Singing," is responsible for this significant community undertaking, which will be open to the public.

Under the cerulean desert skies, the great symphony orchestra will play a stirring program of music selected by Georg Schmevoist, conductor. The program contains "Finlandia," (Sibelius), "Indian Dance" (Skilton), "Espana" (Cabrler), and Ernest Bloch's epic rhapsody "America." The people of Perris valley have learned the anthem which concludes Bloch's work symbolizing the destiny of America and will sing it at the close of the concert.

The "desert theatre" lies on the outskirts of Perris, 17 miles south of Riverside on the inland state highway to San Diego. All highways leading to the concert are well marked and unlimited free parking facilities have been provided. The symphony concert will begin at 8 o'clock Sunday afternoon.




