

Torrance Loses 11 Inning Game

Patched-up Tansey Team Loses to Monrovia Outfit Sunday

Sunday's game at Monrovia, between Torrance and the Monrovia team, went 11 innings to a final score of 8 to 9, with Torrance on the short end.

With a patched up lineup, Manager Ed Tansey was unable to present his usual strong attack, and at the same time and for the same reason, his defense against the onslaughts of opposing batsmen were reduced practically to the infield.

Three of the regulars were absent from the game, and their places were filled by willing but inexperienced youngsters.
