

CHURCHES OF CHRIST, SCIENTIST
"Doctrine of Atonement" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon Sunday, April 21, in all Christian Science Churches, branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass.
Paul's words to the Ephesians, "Walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling savour," constituted the Golden Text.
Among the Scriptural verses of the Lesson-Sermon, cited in the Christian Science Quarterly, were the following words from I John: "In this was manifested the love of God towards us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world."
A correlative passage from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," presented these words of Mrs. Eddy: "Jesus of Nazareth taught and demonstrated man's oneness with the Father, and for this we owe him endless homage. His mission was both individual and collective. He did life's work aright not only in justice to himself, but in mercy to mortals—to show them how to do theirs, but not to do it for them nor to relieve them of a single responsibility."
