Johnson, Stitts, Blumenthal, Santich, Ables, Aspittle, Scrivner, Kelley, Robinson, Wolverson, Powers and Walker composed the Narbonne team. Poly high will oppose Narbonne's second team today on the local field. Tomorrow Narbonne journeys to Manchester playground to meet George Washington high school in the second game of the series. Narbonne pitched a nice game against George Washington high 10-4 in the opening game of the Marine League baseball season on Griffin field. Captain Jack Santich led the Gaucho attack at bat with two singles and a triple in five trips to the plate. John Stitts also collected two hits. Wolverson, Scrivner, Morigson, Aspittle and Blumenthal did the rest of Narbonne's hitting. Powers and Wolverson made brilliant catches in the outfield.

They scored again in the third. Narbonne trailed along till the fifth inning when hits by Santich and Scrivner and Wolverson brought in the runs to give the Gauchos a 5-4 lead. Male Chorus Date Here Postponed


