

Gang Beats Up on Bootlegger

WILMINGTON.—Associates with whom he had visited a bootlegging joint last night beat up and severely cut John McHugh of 402 East Anaheim boulevard and dumped him from a car at 900 East Anaheim where Officer Mulvey picked him up with a police ambulance.

The license plate numbers on the car were secured by a spectator who saw McHugh dumped out of the car and it is possible arrests will be made today.
