

MacMarr Stores Take Over Mutual Stores Last Week

One of the largest chain store mergers ever effected on the Pacific Coast was consummated last week with the conclusion of the negotiations for the formal acquisition of the extensive chain of Mutual Stores, Inc., by MacMarr Stores, Inc., through the latter's subsidiary California Corporation, MacMarr Stores, Ltd.

Negotiations for the transfer of the money were concluded through a long distance telephone conversation between the group of Pacific Coast stores, investors and bankers and the First National Bank in New York, the amount involving approximately \$6,000,000 in cash and securities. As soon as notification of the transfer was obtained, the Mutual Stores immediately became an integral part of the MacMarr system.

In connection with the merger it was announced that \$1,000,000 in new bonds and \$400,000 preferred stock of Mutual Stores are being called for redemption.

The addition of the Mutual chain will increase the number of stores now operated by MacMarr, already the second largest grocery chain west of the Mississippi, by approximately 300 stores, 50 meat markets, 30 delicatessens, several crockeries, an ice cream plant and bakeries and will increase total sales approximately \$16,000,000 per year. The acquisition brings the total number of MacMarr units to approximately 900, with total annual sales of more than \$45,000,000. Although MacMarr's was founded originally in the Pacific Northwest region, the addition of the Mutual group, along with Von's, Morrison's and Crown Emporium, now gives the California division approximately 500 stores, a greater number than is possessed by the chain outside of California.
