

### Torrance Rout Old Jinx, Wins

Tanscytes Trim P. E. Nino 4 to 3 on San Pedro Lot Sunday

By trimming the Pacific Electric nine by a score of 4 to 3 last Sunday on the home grounds of the Pacific Steamship Co., at San Pedro, Torrance busted the jinx that has followed them persistently in their games on this field. Three times Torrance has had games won on this diamond, only to have victory snatched away in the closing frames. But last Sunday, in spite of a little ragged playing in the early innings, Torrance climbed in to the lead and held it until the finish.

Threatening weather kept some of the fans away, but the small crowd which attended the bleachers saw one of the best games of the league schedule so far.

The P. E. team led off at bat, and after two were out Bouett hailed one into the center garden which Frost misjudged and the ball rolled to the fence for a home run. Blewitt singled but died at first when Rennie rolled out.

In Torrance's half of this frame Frost, aveared up for his mistake by waiting out Chamberlin for the first and only pass he issued, took second on Ducaza's single and scored on Wolfe's hard drive. Roy File tripled scoring Johnny and Wolfe, making the count three to one in Torrance's favor.

With one gone in the second, Hahn drove one to the outfield for a safety and scored on Mays' single. Mays stole second but the bidding rally was checked when Mike File fanned Chamberlin and Emerson was thrown out at first. Torrance scored one in their half on a single by Goodman, a sacrifice by Mike File and a triple by Frost.

The railroad boys made one more threat in the fourth and succeeded in putting over one run, but in spite of three hits and an error that should have been an easy out they were unable to tie the count.

The Torrance infield was a stone wall on defense, as is shown by the number of assists. Goldman who replaced Atwood at short handed seven chances without an error, Mike File relayed six grounders to first, covered first himself for one out and although not credited with a hit he connected with the ball for a long fly and for two grounders, one a perfect sacrifice laid down along the third base line and the other a fielder's choice.

Atwood who was out because of an injury to his ankle will probably be back in the line-up next Sunday, releasing Goldman to his regular position in the outfield.

The tenth grade is now leading in the inter-class football league as a result of the 12-0 win over the 11th grade Wednesday night. Next week the final game for the championships will be played.

Mrs. Paul Kasper attended an all day picnic at Orange county park Saturday given by the alumni of the class of 1916 of Huntington Park high school.




