Redondo Beach Plans Festive Summer Opening, June 22-23

Redondo Beach will stage two gala days featuring the opening of the Summer Season on Saturday and Sunday, June 22 and 23.

A program of high-class entertainment will be provided consisting of free vaudeville acts and band concerts both days. Special feature attractions will be the Flying Tremaines in their sensational Trapeze Act and the Black Watch Pipers—entertainers supreme.




