## RECORDER'S COURT

**HEARING OF JULY 5**  
K. Yamada was arrested on the complaint of Paul K. Wilson for selling strawberries not labeled with the name and address of the shipper, in violation of Section 15 of the California Fruit and Vegetable Standardization Act of 1927. He was fined \$100 or 100 days, \$90 of which was suspended.

T. Yamate plead guilty to the same charge and was fined \$100 or 100 days, with \$90 suspended. He was also charged with deceptive packing of the berries, placing the larger berries on top of the basket in direct violation of Section 12 of the California Fruit and Vegetable Act, and for this he was fined \$100 or 100 days with \$75 suspended.

T. Mori was also charged with deceptive packing of berries, for which he was fined \$100 or 100 days, with \$75 suspended for one year to be paid immediately if re-arrested.

## Chaney Has Jungle Home in "Where East Is East"—Here

An indoor grove of plants from with screeching monkeys swinging from bough to bough and a great Chinese courtyard covering the entire area of a big stage was only one of the remarkable settings constructed for Lon Chaney's new two-act play, "Where East Is East," which commences Friday and Saturday, July 12 and 13 at the Torrance theatre. It was one of the largest interior settings employed in years, covering two entire acres under a roof. The stage floor was perforated with great holes through which the roots of the tropical trees were lowered and transplanted in the soil below, and sod was then placed around them. The entire flooring of the courtyard was so treated and a great bronze Buddha and other Oriental images set on foundations.

The reason for this odd handling of a setting was that the tropical plants employed required artificial heat to keep them in condition, the stage and set being in effect a huge hothouse. Several hundred pigeons were also housed in the set, as well as cages of tigers and leopards.

The setting represents Chaney's jungle home and animal compound in a vivid mystery plot directed by Ted Browning, who also wrote it, with Harry Sinclair, Drago, Larry Wolfe, Estelle Taylor, Lloyd Hughes and others of note are in the cast.

Desperate battles with wild animals, a death struggle with a giant gorilla and other thrills embellish the underlying love theme of the new play. Scenes of elephants and other animals figure in the vivid tale.

"The Flying Marine," starring Ben Lyon, is the Sunday feature at the Fox Redondo. The picture has dialogue, music and sound effects. Appearing with Ben Lyon are Shirley Mason and Jason Robards. Monday and Tuesday, July 15 and 16, the Fox Redondo will show "Alibi," which is said to set a new forward step in the new art of talking and sound pictures. It's a United Artists all dialogue under-world thriller directed by Roland West, who has to his credit such successes as "The Bat," "The Unknown Purple," "The Monster" and "The Dove."

## RECIPES

I am a faddist for foods that come to our tables direct from the lap of Mother Nature. Fresh and raw if possible; unadulterated if possible; and if any foods must be refined, please do not refine them to death. So I believe in fresh fruits and vegetables if they can be obtained; fresh milk rather than canned; whole wheat bread in place of white; and brown rice rather than the kind that we may be more acquainted with.

**BROWN RICE POP-OVERS**  
1 cup boiled brown rice  
1/2 cup flour  
1 pint sweet milk  
3 eggs  
1 tablespoon butter  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Soak sweet milk and stir into it the rice flour, sugar and salt. Beat thoroughly together and add eggs well beaten. Bake in hot oven twenty minutes.

**BROWN RICE FRITTERS**  
1 cup brown rice  
1 pint milk  
3 eggs  
1 tablespoonful sugar  
2 tablespoonfuls butter  
Boil rice in milk until soft and all the milk is absorbed, then remove, add yolk of eggs, sugar and butter; when cold serve with butter and jam.

**VARIED RECIPES**  
Subscribers who do not care for the recipes as grouped this month, may use any of the above in the customary way—amplifying them with such of the following as may be needed to fill the usual space allotted to our recipes:

**SCALLOPED HAM AND POTATOES**  
Into a well-buttered pan put slices of raw peeled potatoes and a little pepper. Then a layer of uncooked, sliced ham. Add another layer of potatoes and ham and pour on thin cream sauce (1 tablespoon flour, 1 tablespoon butter, to 1 cup milk). Sprinkle bread crumbs on top and bake in a moderate oven until brown and potatoes are well done. Serve hot. Just enough ham can be used to give the desired flavor, which has the advantage of making a little ham go a long way. For plenty this can be baked at home in a heavy tin dish with a cover and reheated over hot water on a campfire.
