The United States has the lowest average cost to consumer of 18.3 cents, while Bolivia tops the list, according to well authenticated figures.

THAT CAR OF YOURS
Valve springs become weakened after long use and should be replaced.
Examining the distributor of your car occasionally and clean all oil, grease, and dirt from the ignition points.
On cars that use single contact electrical systems be sure to use the same candle power globes in each headlight. Otherwise one light will burn extremely bright and the other one dim.
Front wheels out of alignment cause rapid and uneven wear of front tires. The right will suffer most, because of the arrangement of the steering assembly.
Knocks are always annoying. The principal causes are: lack of oil, too lean a mixture, spark advanced too far, wrong timing, and pre-ignition due to excessive carbon.
A tapping noise in the motor that appears regularly may be traced to a loose valve tappet. It is not a difficult job to adjust the tappets. Nevertheless a mechanic who is familiar with the job should be called upon.
On long trips, remember to drive with the spark advanced as far as possible without causing a knock. An advanced spark is a great fuel saver. However, the spark should always be retarded on starting the motor, in order to avoid a back-fire.

THE CLOSING UP, VACATING AND ABANDONING OF THAT PORTION OF THAT CITY STREET DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:
A portion of Catalina Avenue, in the City of Torrance, as shown on map of Tract No. 8375, as recorded in Book 145, Pages 98 and 99 of Maps, Records of Los Angeles County, State of California, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Goodyear Expects
to Operate Trans-
Ocean Airship

Miller and Boles, Goodyear dealers at 1818 Cabrillo, have been advised that the contractors pushing construction to the limit, Goodyear's Airship dock at Florence and McKinley avenues, on the grounds of the Los Angeles plant, is fast nearing completion.
The "Volunteer" has been flying daily over and around Los Angeles; training flying personnel, studying flying conditions in the South, and giving many notable people their first pleasant experience in lighter-than-air travel.
The "Volunteer" is only one of Goodyear's airship fleet; there now being in operation in the East the "Pillager," the "Parasol" and the "Mayflower," with two additional ships under construction ready to be put into service shortly.
All of these ships are training ships for training Goodyear's airship personnel for the larger type of dirigibles that Goodyear expects to operate in trans-oceanic flying in the not far distant future.
Two mammoth ships are now being constructed at Akron, Ohio, each of 5,000,000 cubic feet of helium capacity, for the United States Navy.
An idea of the size of these ships is indicated by the comparison of the length of the "Volunteer" (128 feet) with the 300 foot Navy airships.
