ORDINANCE NO. 188 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE REGULATING THE USE OF POISON GASES IN REFRIGERATING AND OTHER DEVICES. The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to use, sell, rent, or install any refrigerating or cooling device or other device using methyl chloride gas or other non-odorless poisonous gas in the operation of same unless there shall be mixed with such gas at all times a sufficient amount of harmless odorous gas or substance, so that any escape of such poisonous gas in such quantities as will endanger life or health will be accompanied by the escape of sufficient of such harmless odorous gas as will be noticeable to the senses of persons in the same room or in the vicinity of such machine or device.
