County Prisoners Earn Their Keep Working on Roads

There were 978 county jail prisoners who served penalties for various misdemeanors against the law by working at the sheriff's detention camps during the year ending July 1, 1929, according to the announcement of Sheriff Wm. I. Traeger. These men helped in building several miles of roadway through the Sierra Madre mountains at different locations. They received wages of 50c a day for their labor and had 5 days commuted from their sentences for each month of work they put in. The difference between the wages paid the prisoners and the net value of their road-building, it is claimed, has entirely offset the cost of keeping the prisoners.

The sheriff's detention camps were first started by Traeger in 1921 and total 6 at present. Since that time, 4,348 men have served their time in these camps. The prisoners are not shackled or watched by armed guards. Hardy ever does one try to escape. According to the sheriff, the camp life has improved the prisoners physically and morally, while at the same time they have served to remove the cost burden of the prisoners' keep from the taxpayers.


