Los Angeles Universities Offer Game a Week Until November 30

Pacific Coast football schedules, just released, announce a dozen games of more or less interest to the Torrance devotees, to be played in Los Angeles, or near by.

U.S.C. has scheduled 11 games, of which eight will be played at home. Its first date will be Sept. 28, with U.C.L.A. furnishing the opposition. From that time until November 30, U.S.C. will provide one game a week. Its three out-of-town games will be at Oct. 12, Washington at Seattle, Oct. 26, Stanford at Stanford, Nov. 16, Notre Dame at Chicago. U.S.C.'s final game will be played Dec. 14 against Carnegie Tech.

Football Practice to Begin at Once at Torrance High, Says Nylander

Football practice at the Torrance high school will start immediately, says Coach Nylander, who will be here this week to look over the field and put the finishing touches to his plans for the season. Suits will be given out right after school Tuesday.

With the first game little more than a month away, Coach Nylander is facing his serious problem in whipping into shape some of the green material, which is all he will have to work with, in time to make a creditable showing against Gardena on October 4.

Ten men of the varsity squad of last year have been lost to the team, due to graduation or failure to return to school. Bob Balliett, Howard Totter, Paul Welch, Al Pennington, Ralph Harter, Richard Walter, Gerald Clark, Homer Webber, Captain John Reynolds and Roy McReynolds have been lost to the squad, so that the team for the 1929 season will have to be rebuilt from the ground up, and although the youngsters coming up show considerable promise, their lack of experience will be a handicap which will be hard to overcome.

However, the rather gloomy outlook does not mean that there will be any let-up for the squads, but indicates instead that there will be some steady drill practice and hard work ahead of the candidates who show up during the next few weeks.

A charging machine, promised by the Torrance Kiwanis club, for which plans were furnished by Coach Nylander three weeks ago, is expected to be ready in a few days, which equipment will be of enormous value to the line.

Three teams are to be developed, according to Nylander, a varsity squad composed of the heavyweights of which Harold Stevenson and Al Mintun will share honors as captains. Ralph Dunje is named as manager.
