Chairs Furnished Fans For World Series Broadcasts

World series fans will be furnished with comfortable chairs while they listen to the radio broadcast of the games, through the courtesy of Irvin Sargeant of the Torrance Radio company, and Ben Rappaport of the United Cigar Stores agency.

The Torrance Radio company will install one of the best Crosley radios with loud speakers and seventy-five chairs will be placed on the vacant lot adjoining the radio company at 1608 Gramerey avenue near Cabrillo.

Salvation Army Plans \$298,000 in Buildings

Brigadier James C. Bell, officer in charge of the Los Angeles division of the Salvation Army, returned this week from attending a meeting of the council of western states, presided over by Commissioner Adam Griford. 
