A brief mention was made in our last issue concerning our office building and it may be of interest to note some of the things it contains. It is divided into various private offices; it has two large fireproof vaults; a telephone exchange connected by direct wiring to the Petroleum Securifiles building at Los Angeles as well as trunk lines to the Long Beach exchange. There is a telegraph teletype machine which is one of the more recent inventions for the transmission of confidential information.

One of the rooms is devoted exclusively to the printing of blue prints with wash rack and laundry being safely stored in a fire proof vault. The other vault contains statistics of the accounting department.

There is a Cincinnati time recorder and clock that automatically starts everybody to work and notifies them when they may cease their labors. High Bank at Bad Corner to Be Removed

The high bank of earth at the corner of Madrona and Redondo boulevards is to be removed, it was learned this week by Chamber of Commerce officials who have been seeking permission for the clearing of this hazardous traffic obstacle for several months. The action called for the co-operation of the C. C. M. O. Dr. del Amo, utility companies who have service poles to move, and various other agencies. Motor Coach Co. Reduces Fares

The Motor Coach Company this week announced fare decreases from Torrance to near-by cities. The one way fare to Long Beach is now 48 cents and the round trip 65 cents; to Lomita, 10 cents and round trip 15 cents; to Redondo 10 cents and round trip 15 cents.
