

When the motor vibrates, sometimes the cause can be laid to loose motor leg bolts. These should be inspected quite frequently.

On all cars the fan belt plays a very important part in the running of the motor. Therefore, particular attention should be paid to the proper adjustment and lubrication of the fan pulley bearing.
