Tonight, Tuesday, Lew Cody and Aileen Pringle appear in "Wickedness Preferred." Tonight is also china night for the Indies.


DAIRYMEN TO HOLD MASS MEETING WED.

According to the committee sponsoring the meeting the dairy business is facing a crisis, and dairymen's problems will be discussed fearlessly by good speakers and the dairymen themselves. An invitation is extended to all dairymen in this district to attend this meeting. Seats for 1500 have been provided.

CALIFORNIA CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS AS RECOMMENDED BY REPUBLICAN LEADERS

State to Have Twenty-Two Seats in House on Basis of Census Taken Next Year

Members of the Republican county central committees of California are studying the problem of Congressional reapportionment with a



view of securing adequate representation in Washington for California after the 1930 Federal census shall indicate the number of additional Congressmen to be allotted the Golden State. The first comprehensive plan for such reapportionment within the state has been prepared by the Los Angeles County Republican Central Committee, and is receiving wide spread attention at this time in all counties of California. The plan was announced at a meeting of committee chairmen representing the ten southern counties at San Diego in September, and again considered at a similar meeting in Santa Barbara in October. The population of California in 1930 is estimated at 5,000,000, according to Col. William Eric Fowler, chairman of the Los Angeles County Republican Central Committee, who presented the plan. Using this estimate for a basis, the plan of Congressional reapportionment within the state was prepared. This plan contemplates California receiving eleven additional Congressmen, which would give the state a total of twenty-two seats in the House. Colonel Fowler states, "Assuming these estimates are correct, the ten southern counties will have 54.55 per cent of the population of the state. The Federal authorities estimate a United States population of 120,000,000 in 1930, and this divided by 435, the number of seats in the House of Representatives, gives an average Congressional district of 275,000 population," he continued. "This plan suggests twelve Congressional districts in the southern counties with an average population of 281,000 in each district and ten Congressional districts in the north, with an average population of 282,000. Even should our state population fall short of the 5,000,000 mark we should be certain of twenty-one Congressmen and perhaps twenty-two. "It is estimated that Los Angeles County will have sufficient population for nine Congressmen. The Republican Central Committee has voted to accept eight in order that the remaining nine southern counties may have four Congressmen between them. "This plan has been submitted by committee chairmen to leading citizens in their various counties, the members of their county committees and of the State Legislature, and reports indicate it has met with general approval. Some slight changes have been suggested, which can be easily made to satisfy certain sections without materially altering the plan as a whole, and so slight changes were, of course be expected."
