


**Fancy Roofs For Flying Hoofs At
'Agua Caliente Made In Torrance**





When the new Jockey Club at Agua Caliente, Old Mexico, makes its bow to the racing world on December 28, the event will be of interest to Torrance people to whom a horse race means no more than another cigarette after dinner. And here's why: The attractive roofs in the group of Spanish Mission style stables at the new \$2,000,000 race course were made in none other than this "Modern Industrial City" of Torrance. In other words, Torrance makes fancy roofs for flying hoofs.


Over 450,000 square feet of "Ribbed-Ridge" sheet roofing which was required to cover the racing stables were made in Torrance by the Hall Metal Products company in the modern plant at 1811 21st street. The contract included all fifty new stables. The "Ribbed-Ridge" sheets are painted brick red and closely resemble tile, harmonizing neatly with the Spanish Mission style of architecture used in the group of buildings about the two million dollar race course.

The Hall Metal Products company claim to have the largest press equipment in the entire southland, and the copper bearing steel sheets made by the Columbia Steel plant in Torrance are bought by the Hall company and pressed into the "ridge-ribbed" form, which not only enhances the appearance of the roof, but gives it many other advantages in service. It provides an efficient roof as tile. Mr. Paul Clark, and is much lighter in weight, requiring less rigid walls to support it.

The combination of stucco walls and corrugated iron roofing sheets is a new idea in architecture that is being used for the first time at the Agua Caliente stables. There are over 50 buildings that have been so treated, and as one views them from the grandstand, they present a very pleasing effect. Each stable has its individual design of end walls which relieves the monotony of the ordinary group of stables at racing courses.





KNOW YOUR HIGH SCHOOL

This is the next of a series of articles written by students at Torrance High School about their school

The purpose of this association is to promote co-operation with the department of physical education, to promote a spirit of democracy, physical and mental efficiency, good sportsmanship and athletic and social activities.

The associate membership of the association is open to all of the girls of the Torrance high school who are interested in physical education activities.

Active membership of the association is open to all girls who have obtained fifty points (50) required in the "point system." Honorary membership may be extended by invitation of the executive board to faculty members or alumnae. Advisory membership includes the girls' vice principal and faculty member of girls physical education department.

Active members only, have the power to vote. Officers consist of a president, vice president, recording secretary, secretary-treasurer, and heads of sports.

The duties of the executive board are to appoint all committees, to decide upon eligibility for membership, to make recommendations and suggestions regarding all affairs pertaining to the association, to authorize new sports, to take charge of special activities assigned by the president and to

control all matters not otherwise provided for.

Amendments for the constitution may be amended by a majority vote of members present at any meeting of the association, provided the proposed amendments shall be posted at least one week before action is taken upon them.

The point system is based upon:

1. Scholarship—No failures the preceding term and passing the present semester.
 2. Health—Girls must pass through a medical examination given by a school physician. They must also comply with rules for healthful living.
 3. Good sportsmanship.
 4. To make a team a girl must be out for three-fourths of the practices.
 5. No one is eligible for a school team if she is representing an outside organization in any sport.
- Team Activity—Anyone making a team is awarded 50 points. If it is a championship team, 50 points more are granted. Taking part in a school program or public performance gives 25 points. (One girl may not receive points for more than two performances a year).
- Executive work for a semester, Offices in G. A. A. The president, (who is girls' athletic manager for the school) is entitled to—50 points.

- Vice president—25 points.
- Recording secretary—25 points.
- Secretary-treasurer—25 points.
- Team captain—15 points.
- Yell leader—10 points.
- Helpers in physical education department: Office girl—25 points.
- Sports editor for weekly paper for semester—25 points.
- Sports editor for annual—15 points.

Miscellaneous: Perfect record in class, (this should mean a grade of A and should be based on attendance, ability, attitude, maintenance of good posture)—25 points.

Scholarship: Any girl who has won 100 points a semester and who is a member of the school honor scholarship society should receive—50 points.

Any girl having won 100 points a semester and has nothing below a "B" in scholarship, is allowed—25 points.

The number of points required for a school letter equals 500 points. Letters with one star equals 700 points, with two stars, 800; three stars, 1100; four stars, 1500. The letter should be awarded upon recommendation of the executive board and department of physical education in appreciation of excellence in: athletic ability, sportsmanship, and an active interest in the activities of the school.

This is to show the principles for which the Girls' Athletic Association stands. The organization is not only a source of pleasure, but a source for physical improvement, and good fellowship.
