ATTRACTIVE HOME OF MR. AND MRS. LANZ

Pictured above is the attractive home of Mr. and Mrs. Bert Lanz and family at 1418 Engracia avenue, which was recently built by Fred Hansen and sold to Mr. Lanz, who is plant manager of the United States Steel mills here.

The house has many novel features and is unusual because of its roominess and attractive color combination. The dwelling is 34 feet by 46 feet and is built on a lot 50 feet by 150 feet deep. It has seven rooms including a large breakfast nook and three large bedrooms.

Let us take a peep into this new home of the steel company manager. On entering we are greeted by a spacious living room and adjoining dining room, both of which have cream walls and mahogany woodwork. The floors are of excellent quality oak inlaid with walnut. All other floors throughout the home are hardwood except the kitchen and breakfast nook which are covered with very attractive linoleum.

"My what a large roomy breakfast nook," you exclaim as you notice there is ample room for a table and six chairs, all neatly decorated. Its walls are of delicate orchid, trimmed in yellow and black, harmonizing with the kitchen, in which is decorated in green, and trimmed with orchid with a green tile sink and black fixtures. The three bedrooms are decorated with refreshing individuality for each room. One is in light blue, another in green, and the third in pink and blue. All are papered and painted over the paper with a fascinating "marcel" or fan-shaped wave effect which is very pretty. Each bedroom has a large clothes closet and there is one cedar lined closet.

The bath is green tile with a lily border, and large enough to accommodate a tub and shower.

In the roomy screened porch are found the laundry tubs, a large 20 gallon hot water heater, and an old time pantry-style cooler. Throughout the home there is ample cupboard space and a linen closet. Fred Hansen, the builder, also provided an electric refrigerator and a complete lawn sprinkling system. A double garage has been built on the alley which matches the white stucco of the house, trimmed in blue. Since the picture was taken, the landscaping has been completed and it is not hard to imagine what a pretty picture a few months of warm sunshine will make of the growing shrubs that grace this attractive home.
