

## It's Hard to Improve on the Clinkers



**CALIFORNIA** bungalows in natural brick are so infrequent in that region as to be almost curiosities. Yet this one should satisfy the most fastidious. About it is an air of hominess so pronounced that you cannot escape it. And what promise of delightful afternoon siestas in a hammock high and free is held in the shaded coolness of the broad, open porch! The brick are of the clinker variety, not extreme in their roughness, but unusually rich in their wide range of color tones. To have either painted or whitewashed them would have sacrificed a beauty no other type of wall affords. With blends in a pleasing harmony. In its interior arrangement the bungalow is charming. One enters a large living room direct from the porch. The dining room to the left is large and cheerfully lighted.
