and brick walls faced with buff brick. Indiana limestone was used for trim. The buildings rest on 2250 composite piles. Except for the row of officials' offices, the reception room, display room and general offices in the northwest corner, the building is without wood. The plant was designed by Albert Kahn, Inc., Detroit, industrial architect who has designed all the Ford factories and assembly plants.

The main plant is one story high, the office section containing two stories. The warehouse also has two stories with steel sliding doors opening on the 540-foot concrete dock, also resting on composite piling. The traveling cranes unload direct from the steamers or freight cars into either story of the warehouse that could store 1000 cars. The dock has a concrete retaining wall to hold the fill below the warehouse. On the south side of the wharf is an oil house 61 by 123 feet.

North of the plant is a fenced-in parking area for the cars of the Ford workers, capable of parking 750. Along the western side of the plant, the company built and paved a broad street with sidewalk for use of officials and their visitors.

The assembly plant is replete with features that attract and hold attention. It has more than a score of departments. Paint is mixed in sixteen different barrels in the paint house, pumped through as many pipes each 2200 feet long and sprayed from booths as the conveyors pass. There is more than a half mile of tracks within the building, and at its north end a garage, repair department, machine shop and store.

Construction of the plant required about eight and a half months.
