Bathers Told To Expose As Much As They Decently Can

 SACRAMENTO, Calif., (UP)—Exposure commensurate with decency will be the motto of the California bathing beauty as she romps on the sunny strands of the Pacific this summer, if she takes the advice of the state department of public health.

Cheerfully admitting that "decency" is a word to be defined in various local ordinances, the department has reiterated its edict that sunshine, and yet more sunshine, is the way to health.

With her conscience as her guide, the California flapper can follow the department's rules on this sunny subject.

"Take it easy at first," is the opening admonition. "A healthy tan on the legs, arms and back is not acquired in a day."

"If you are about to start on this campaign, via the swimming suit route, take along a beach wrap that will completely cover you. Then expose the body to the sun for a few minutes in the morning and afternoon of the first day."

"Follow this with longer periods of exposure, until the skin does not smart after the sun bath. For dark complexioned persons the flesh may become accustomed to the sun within a few days. Blondes may take a week or more."

The department has no recommendation to make concerning particular types of suits. Classing those of 20 years ago that looked

like a sack enveloping the body from neck to toes as "aburd," the department believes a "happy medium" can be reached—apparently somewhere short of the extreme one-piece model.

Turning from the beach to the street, the department recommends "common sense" in summer attire. "Stockingless legs do not interest us from the moral standpoint," the department declared. "But they are healthy, for just that much more of the body is exposed to the sun. Light underthings and light dresses, cut reasonably, are desirable. The skin breathes and if the air can reach every part of the body, so much the better."

Sun baths in the "altogether" are an ideal method of procuring for oneself the beneficial effects of the sun, it is said. But the same warning of "taking it easy," applies to this form of solar therapy, according to the department.

Breaking Law Cost Torrance Folk \$9,473.55

 SACRAMENTO, Calif., (UP)—Breaking the law, a quaint old pastime that seems to be growing in popularity these days, cost citizens of Torrance exactly \$9,473.55 in fines last year.

The offenses for which these penalties were levied included everything from peddling without a license, craphooting, "stepping on the gas" on state highways, to assault and battery, selling home brew or common salt.

To combat the rapid growth of crime in California, a new state department of penology was created by the 1929 legislature, and is now functioning. This embraces the Divisions of Criminal Identification, State Prison Board, Narcotics Enforcement, Criminology, Pardons and Commutations and the Crime Commission.

The Crime Commission, formerly a legislative agency, carries on a year-round study of crime, its cause and prevention. At the 1931 legislature it will come forward with a new program of remedial legislation.

Last year marked a substantial gain in crime, as indicated by fines paid in incorporated cities, which totaled \$4,091,802.89 as compared to \$3,823,817.76 the year previous.

County fine collections aggregated \$1,683,151 as against \$1,706,325.22 the year before. The city fines resulted from convictions in municipal courts, while the county penalties were meted out by justice, probation and superior courts.

Los Angeles, biggest city of California, was the biggest lawbreaker. It had a total of \$1,527,749, while the county of Los Angeles totaled \$384,182. San Francisco's figure, which included both city and county, was \$905,355.

The city of Corning, for the third successive year, reported no collection of fines, although it is in violation of the law. The lowest total for the year reported by any city was \$3.00 for the city of Ceres.


