High Standard Life Guard Service at Redondo and Manhattan Beaches

"In taking over the supervision and maintenance of Manhattan and Redondo beaches on May 20th, it will be the purpose of the County Department of Recreation Camps and Playgrounds to maintain the same standard of lifeguard service and beach supervision now employed at Santa Monica Canyon Beach and Alamitos Bay, and to provide generous opportunities for aquatic sports and beach recreation." F. E. Wadsworth, superintendent, declared yesterday.

E. H. Carroll, supervisor of county lifeguards is planning to install eight lifeguards at Manhattan for beach patrol duty, who will also

be qualified to give free swimming instruction, as well as to direct tumbling gymnastics. The Beach Division holds the record of no drownings on county supervised beach areas.

"Headquarters for the Beach Division will be at Manhattan, where activities of lifeguards and other employees for the four county beach areas will be directed.

make some sort of a living—un-equipped, without resources and pitifully ignorant of the cruel ways of the desert. Evidently, they were all, without exception, completely helpless, for they are every one abandoned!

Notice, if you will, the rows of sticks which were once fruit trees. Now mere ghostly sticks. Peer into the wells. Water there, you say. Ah, yes, but how much water? Not a small fraction of the great quantity necessary to irrigate a desert with a raging thirst. Here is a place that is marked only by a heap which used to be a house. All gone. It was no use, the desert reclaims its own. Great strength is required to wage a continual fight against it and win. There is a new looking place which you wonder about. It looks flourishing even now. But upon closer inspection you find that it is vacant too, like the rest of its older brothers. It certainly is newer, but men never learn, it seems.

If you are serious minded you can spend several hours in this region and find things to make you think. If you are in a lighter mood, there are many amusing things to be found. Explore these little houses, but do not disturb them very much, for there are people, I assure you, who still entertain a hope that water, or gold, or oil, or something will open up that country and make life worth while for them again, out there. In the former occupants try to keep their place in order for a year or so, but just as invariably the slow decay wins out.

Historians are written on the walls and in the papers and things left in these houses. For instance, once found a school book of some child who had evidently gone every day into Victorville to school. There were notations and solution to arithmetic problems written therein by some adult hand, probably mother's. Bills, letters, magazines and papers told a vivid story of hardship and it was easy to see that they had to go and find work in the city. In another place I found a bundle of love letters between a man and woman and covering a period of ten years. They finally got married and went there to live. Her name was "Bertha" and his "Moss." Another place had been occupied by a moonshiner and bootlegger and certainly smelled bad. Only a step in the decline of the American home.

You may see a place which is relatively new and occupied. Pay him a visit. He will be glad to see you if he is typically a desert farmer and you can get first hand the story of his hallucination. One family of old folks whom I visited a number of times and who later had to move or starve to death, believed in the grace of the Almighty to provide for them, also some crystal gazer in Los Angeles who predicted an immense airship and landing field to be built on their place. Contrast these enterprises with Adalanto and reflect on the power of organized capital plus intelligence. The quickest return trip is made over the same route.


